Harvest Festival: Tradition of the Season by Liz Jenkins

The first Winter Park Harvest Festival was held on November 20, 2010. This sunny day-long event brought together area farmers, gardeners, artists, chefs, musicians, entrepreneurs, churches, non-profit organizations, and community members to celebrate and learn more about locally and organically produced food.

Regular Orlando Monthly Meeting attender, Karie Brown, announced the festival after Meeting for Worship, one week earlier, and participated in the event as a local artist. The announcement stirred me to walk to Winter Park from my home near the Meeting House and enjoy both the journeying and the destination. When I was growing up in an English village the Harvest Festival was a fragrant, gorgeous, joyful time; the altar of our church overflowed with fruits and vegetables from everyone's farms, gardens, and allotments, and there was always a huge centerpiece of loaves and fishes made of golden baked bread. There was more than enough to take to the older folks in the village and hospitals and alms houses in town.

While the festival under the pines and

palms of Central Park was quite a different occasion, it was equally colorful and full of wonderful aromas. There were over one hundred grow boxes with thriving beets, lettuce, and so forth, cultivated by children with their teachers, local church groups, and families. There was a wealth of information on everything from worm bins to solar LED lights. Copies of the new "Edible Orlando" magazine were available at many tables and, in the main tent, a series of speakers shared information on topics ranging from the recent Terra Madre slow food festival in Italy to Farm Aid.

Quakers have long valued simplicity, peace, integrity, community, and equality. Increasingly we hear sustainability added to this list. The Winter Park Harvest Festival was a sign of hope that these values are shared by more and more friends and neighbors in our Central Florida community.
