First Day, Fourth Month, April 14, 2019

*The Opening of Worship* - Friends were called to gather by Liz Jenkins, Clerk, at 11:50 am. The Meeting for Worship With An Attention to Business settled with a brief time of silent worship.

*Reading* –

"Each of these Quarterly Meetings were large and sat near eight hours. Here I had occasion to consider that it is a weighty thing to speak much in large meetings for business. First, except our minds are rightly prepared and we clearly understand the case we speak to, instead of forwarding, we hinder business and make more labour for those on whom the burden of the work is laid.

If selfish views or a partial spirit have any room in our minds, we are unfit for the Lord's work. If we have a clear prospect of the business and proper weight on our minds to speak, it behooves us to avoid useless apologies and repetitions. Where people are gathered from far, and adjourning a meeting of business is attended with great difficulty, it behooves all to be cautious how they detain a meeting, especially when they have sat six or seven hours and [have] a great distance to ride home.

In three hundred minutes are five hours, and he that improperly detains three hundred people one minute, besides other evils that attend it, does an injury like that of imprisoning one man five hours without cause." John Woolman, 1758

## REPORTS

*Peace and Social Concerns (P&SC)*– Stephanie Preston-Hughes

Committee will meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of each month. The Agenda will consider where Spirit is moving in our meeting in choosing to address a concern.

1. P&SC will be hosting Laila Hasan Mahmmud Awawda, of the women's artisan collective "Women In Hebron," at Orlando Friends Meeting on Saturday, May 18th, 2019. She will prepare a traditional Palestinian meal and speak about her experience of life in Hebron

and the human rights situation in the city. She will have crafts from the collective available for sale. The event will begin at 7:30 pm, but food will not be served until 8:15 pm, to accommodate those observing Ramadan. Other Quakers from SEYM and Muslim communities in the Orlando area will be invited by PSC Clerk to attend. Laila has agreed to feed dinner to all, regardless of the number who come.

2. P&SC would like to express a deep concern that OMM is sending a message of exclusion and invisibility due to the current bathroom signage at the Meeting House. P&SC, as a Committee of the whole, recommends that OMM "season" a change of signage for both bathrooms to indicate that all genders are welcome to use either bathroom, so that the Meeting may serve as a safe and inclusive place for all and lead the way as a place of worship in the Orlando community. P&SC is seeking input for further discernment regarding this issue before bringing the matter forward for Friends' approval. OMM Friends are encouraged to provide such information by talking with Stephanie or Liz.

In response to a question, Stephanie said the Committee has a budget to cover expenses. Friends accept the P&SC report.

## **Peace and Social Concerns Committee of Orlando Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends met on 14th day, 3rd month, 2019 at 6:00pm.**

In attendance were Stephanie P (clerk), Kody H (minutes), Greg A, Liz J, Gary E, Chris L, Jerry K, Steven R, Rachel D., Vicki C, Bill C, Tom, Beverly W

After gathering in worship and brief check-ins, the clerk reviewed the agenda.

### **Purpose of Peace and Social Concerns**

Clerk would like to spend this meeting clarifying the big picture of the committee's work, communications, and process. There are also many things that have been brought to PSC by committees and individual Friends. We may not get to all of them tonight, but will get a start.

The clerk read the meeting's 2016 minute in response to the Pulse shooting.

### **Working Together**

Meeting times: Clerk's intention is to hold open meetings that as many folks attend as are able, but not spend too much energy trying to find times that work for everyone. Friends noted that our attendance at this meeting is very good, and that may indicate that this time works well; but we don't know who is *not* here. We set an intention, to be held flexibly, to meet on 2nd Thursdays from 6-7:30pm.

Minutes: Kody is taking minutes for this meeting. Clerk's intention for the future is for Friends to rotate recording responsibilities. Friends are reminded that when recording, they are welcome to ask for a pause, and either laptop or handwritten minutes are fine. Friends will volunteer on the day of, and are asked to submit action minutes promptly for meeting for worship with attention to business.

Some Friends raised the question of how the minutes will be posted. After some discussion of Friends' traditional practices around transparency, as well as discussion of potential safety and privacy concerns, Friends were in unity to post minutes publicly on the website, and include a link in Quaker Notes.

Friends raised the question of whether to include names in the minutes. One Friend's query of why we record names at all, or if it was a reflexive practice, led us to deeper discussion. There is a long tradition of this Friends practice, but "because we always have" is not necessarily a compelling reason. It can be helpful to the clerk to take note of who is and isn't represented when a decision is made. There is an integrity to the practice of not making any decisions that we're not willing to have our names on. Ultimately, Friends were in unity to include first names and last initials in our recording.

### **Agenda items/topics**

There is so much that we could do: as a committee, as a monthly meeting. The list of things that are needed and important in the world are almost endless. So we begin by acknowledging that it is not possible to do it all. It is our collective responsibility to determine where our attention should lie. To that end, the clerk requested guidance from the body about the process for preparing an agenda.

Friends affirmed the importance of discerning our leadings, both corporate and individual. Over time, meetings are often drawn to a small set of issues to focus their collective work. Additionally, one or more individual Friends may have passion or leading on a particular issue, and others will offer support. We intend to leave space for Friends who have leadings to bring them to the body.

We encourage the committee clerk to identify an elder/assistant to help with discernment of the agenda, as led. We also request that the clerk hold space for a brief open period at the

end of meetings, for people to bring up additional topics and ideas for possible inclusion on the next meeting's agenda.

Sharing about community events and involvement opportunities: Clerk expects we will regularly have things to post in Quaker Notes (events, announcements, etc). Clerk will listen for things that should be passed on, and also invites Friends to send her things to pass on.

Discernment and information items:

Legislative priorities for FCNL are due by Friday 4/26/19.

FCNL, a Quaker congressional lobby in the Quaker interest, requests feedback from meetings on what issues to prioritize. How should Peace and Social Concerns Committee steward the meeting's discernment process on this issue? The committee accepted Beverly W's offer to facilitate a Conversation to Explore on this topic on March 24th.

The meeting has received a request from the League of Women Voters of Orange County to sign petitions for ballot amendments on assault weapons and Medicaid. We have already agreed to make a petition available for an assault weapon ban. They are now also requesting that we make petitions available related to Medicaid. These are all petitions to put a proposal on the ballot for constitutional amendments, and no individual is required to sign them. Liz is working with LWV to provide the petitions. If anyone is led to do more than that, other organizations may also be working to collect signatures.

Meal and visit from Palestinian speaker

Friend Kody H has received an inquiry from a Palestinian woman from Hebron, Laila H, who is seeking venues where she can prepare a meal and address a community on human rights issues in Hebron. Kody spoke to his experience of Laila's grounded and loving witness for justice and peace. Friends expressed a sense that this is a welcome opportunity to engage on an important issue, and perhaps to partner with other local faith communities.

Friends minuted their unity on this question:

**The Peace and Social Concerns Committee approves the committee clerk and Friend Kody H to work with Laila Hassan to identify a date in May for a meal and presentation at the Orlando Meetinghouse. PSC funds will be used for Laila's travel and food for the meal. The committee intends to make the event open to all SEYM Quakers as well as other interested faith communities locally.**

The committee will also arrange for Laila's hospitality in town.

The clerk thanked Friends for their clear and grounded work considering our priorities and process for our committee.

We closed with open worship.

Peace & Social Concerns Committee

Meeting: April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2019

The Peace & Social Concerns Committee (P&SC) of the Orlando Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends (OMM) met on Thursday, April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. at the OMM Meeting House.

In attendance were Stephanie P. (clerk), Kody H., Liz J., Gary E., Chris L. (ad hoc recording clerk), Steven R., Minerva G., Rachel D., Sharon D., Doug D.

Friends gathered in worship, conducted brief check-ins, and then discussed the following topics.

#### Follow-Up from Last Month's Meeting

On March 24<sup>th</sup>, Beverly W. led a Conversation to Explore in response to the request received from the Friends Committee on National Legislation (FCNL) that Friends within each meeting compile and prioritize a list of issues they would like FCNL to address. Beverly documented the results of the discussion, which need to be formatted and submitted online to FCNL by April 26<sup>th</sup>. Liz agreed to be responsible for forwarding the information to FCNL.

A date has been established for Laila Hassan to visit OMM: Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Since this event occurs during Ramadan, when Muslims may not eat until after sunset, the plan is for doors to open at 7:30 p.m. and for food to be served at about 8:15. Stephanie will reach out to other SEYM Quakers and to Muslim communities in the area and invite them to attend. Laila Hassan has agreed to feed a Palestinian dinner to all, regardless of the number who come.

As a committee of the whole, all members of OMM are members of the P&SC. Friends discussed the extent to which matters brought forward to P&SC should again be presented at OMM's Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business. It was agreed that P&SC should report to OMM in the same manner as any other committee.

#### Matters for Discernment

**Bathroom Signage:** Stephanie brought forward a concern regarding the signage on the bathrooms in the Meeting House, which is currently gender-specific. Friends discussed the concern that transgender individuals would find the current signs to be inhospitable and unfriendly. Liz pointed out that our recent phone inquiries from potential newcomers to the meeting have come from individuals asking if our meeting is transgender-friendly. Stephanie brought forward the suggestion that we replace the current signs on both bathrooms with gender-neutral signs. After much discussion, relating to privacy, safety, the effect on Muslim visitors, etc., Friends minuted the following:

- P&SC shall report as follows at OMM's next Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business:

P&SC would like to express a deep concern that OMM is sending a message of exclusion and invisibility due to the current bathroom signage at the Meeting House. P&SC, as a committee of the whole, recommends that OMM “season” a change of signage for both bathrooms to indicate that all genders are welcome to use either bathroom, so that the Meeting may serve as a safe and inclusive place for all and lead the way as a place of worship in the Orlando community. P&SC is seeking input for further discernment regarding this issue prior to bringing the matter forward for Friends’ approval. OMM Friends are encouraged to provide such input by talking with Stephanie or Liz.

Due to the lengthy discussion regarding bathroom signage, other matters on the agenda for discernment were postponed until the next P&SC meeting.

### Informational Matters

Concerns from Young Friends: Friend Stephanie reported that Young Friends discussed their P&SC concerns on April 7<sup>th</sup>. Among these concerns were human & sex trafficking, school shootings, and violent conflicts in Africa. Stephanie mentioned her surprise at the lack of alarm Young Friends seemed to express on the topic of school shootings.
